

Canadian Family wants caregivers

ONE of the fastest growing employment agencies in Canada has come to Hong Kong in the hopes of finding the right domestic helpers to work as caregivers for the right families in Canada.

Canadian Family Nanny Services Inc. (CFNS) held a successful seminar last October 1st at the YMCA building on Salisbury Road in Tsim Sha Tsui to interview and recruit Filipina domestic helpers here in Hong Kong interested to work in Canada as live-in nannies and caregivers.

"Finding an experienced, reliable, and trustworthy agency can be stressful. We at CFNS only represent the best caregivers and refer only caring, sincere and respectful families. Every family is personally interviewed by us and not through a third party overseas agency. This ensures we

find you the right family that we know will make you happy and to eliminate as much as possible any problem upon your arrival in Canada," said CFNS founder Shellie Sigurdson.

According to Sigurdson, she regularly flies to Hong Kong herself to personally meet and interview the OFW applicants because she wants to ensure that each foreign worker pass CFNS standards before being introduced to their prospective employers.

CFNS has been placing an average of 20 nannies per month since it opened business last year.

Operating under the Canadian government's Live-In Caregiver Program, CFNS also provides a three-month in-home training for both caregivers and employers. Applicants will also have access to a toll free number to contact CFNS.
